Peg Fox (<u>ptamemberatlarge@k497.org</u>), brief intro to the Equity Team at BHS

- Equity team, three prongs
- Faculty, student and parent equity (founded last year)
- Getting to know each other right now. Going through some deep work, talking through issues of race, gender, class
- Monthly meetings last year and starting up again soon
- Had a good response, call for more and got 23 more members this year
- Don't want it to be too big so that the work can be meaningful and deep

#### Principal Schmoeger on the Equity Team <a href="mailto:samantha.schmoeger@k497.org">samantha.schmoeger@k497.org</a>

- This is the Staff Equity team's fourth year
- Consultancy currently happening with the theme of: "Breaking the Cycle"
- This includes revamping the social studies curriculum
- The Student equity team is in its second year, very successful so far. For example, a few years ago, students questioned "why can't we wear hats?" Felt it was a form of oppression. There was and are ongoing discussions of understanding why and how rules were created
- Finally, there's a Parent equity team. They finished a very powerful mission statement. Will get links to it. Overall the message is, "Every child is our child."

\*\*The question is asked in the chat, "How can other parents get involved (since there's a waitlist for the equity team, a feeling that we don't want it to be too large because of the deeper, thoughtful work all involved are doing.) So, is there a plan to involve other parents somehow?

Meryem Bencheikh-Ellis (<u>ptapresident@k497.org</u>) responds: PTA can try to organize workshops, maintain awareness. But overall it's good to keep these groups small so that the deeper work can flourish, so that faculty trusts the work (on parents equity team or faculty equity team).

#### Co-President Report (Meryem Bencheikh-Ellis, High School) ptapresident@k497.org

- \$100 incentive for getting the COVID vaccine. Want to remind the parents that when you go to get your child vaccinated, mention you are from BHS and the \$ will go to the school.
- We had a pop up clinic for Covid vaccines, but it didn't go very well. Disorganized. DOE is organizing a second round of pop up clinics, so please check emails often this month as the school/Principal won't know about it until the evening before.
- Good to know: Brooklyn Children Museum has the shot, City Pointe as well, Barclays-- for 5-11 and 12 and up.
- Second round of EBT is happening. If the parents do not need the EBT card, there's a way to find a place to get the money redistricted or redistributed. Please ask the PTA if you need help.
- On mental health: the DOE started an initiative for educators called, "Let's Talk NYC". Educators and schools have to register, but not sure if Principal Sam has done that.
- An update on school sports; the Volleyball Team was undefeated, won the play off in Manhattan, lost the last game in Queens. Very proud of them. Boys Basketball, coached by our own algebra teacher Mr. Mobley, is undefeated. Currently running scrimmages. First game is November 30.
