Report on Risk-taking from AP Megan Casey (meghancasey@k497.org)

IB learner program: I want to talk a little bit more about risk taking today. What does risk taking mean for our students?

- We always try to instill a sense of agency in our learners. We don't want students parroting what
 other people think (we don't want trained seals). WE want students standing in their own
 perspectives. But you can't have agency without safety. We want students to feel safe bringing
 up what they
- THere's a difference between being unsafe and uncomfortable. You will not grow if you're always comfortable, but also won't grow if you feel unsafe.
- I'm going to share with you the official definition of risk taking as the IB program defines it. "Risk-Takers are **those willing to be wrong in order to learn something new**. They aren't afraid of mistakes. IB Learner Profile: Balanced. Balanced means using a variety of resources and approaches to solve problems."
- How can parents help students with risk taking? Trust your kids.

- Lots of research on this, but it suggests that adult need 5:1 positive feedback to criticism; kids needs a 10:1 ratio (10 positives of noticing of growth in your student and one negative)
- When we're helping a student work through those areas that work, we do it through a strength based approach.
- We approach our students with compassion. Most teens, we can think in terms of a metaphor of a toddler. Toddlers are learning to walk and they want to do it on their own, but they keep looking back to see if you're watching. They need to know you're watching and you have their back, Teens are the same.
