

### Criteria-Based & Best-Fit Grading

As an IB school we use criteria based grading on a scale of O to 7 to assess a student's mastery of the unit being taught. BHS does not determine final grades by using averages. Students' demonstrated mastery of each criteria are used to determine grades.



# tteath & Safety at BHS

- The daily Health Screener is <u>no longer</u>
   <u>required</u> to enter the school building.
- Students and staff who test positive for COVID-19 must isolate for 5 days and can return to school on day 6 if they have no symptoms or symptoms are improving.
- Covid-19 testing is strongly encouraged for students and staff members exposed to the virus.
  - Home test kits will be available in school



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### Cell Phone Policy

Cell phones must be silenced and put away upon entering the school building.

First Infraction - Cell phone will be confiscated. Student can retrieve the cell phone from the Dean at the end of the day (Room 204).



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- Second Infraction Cell phone will be confiscated. The cell phone will remain in the possession of the School Dean until a parent/guardian can come to school to retrieve it.
- Third Infraction A parent conference with the Assistant Principal and School Dean is held. Cell phone is provided to the School Dean each morning for the entirety of the marking period.

- Did you fill out the <u>Elective Form</u> that was sent to you in August? The deadline to fill it out was <u>September 1st</u>.
  - If you are entering BHS with our Culinary code (K21B) you are automatically placed in culinary as your elective, following the CTE track.
- Did you fill out the <u>Language Form</u> that was sent over the Summer?
  - Students are placed in Foreign
     Language classes based on their level of proficiency.
